## Tips on how to connect with your neighbours every day!

- Do you have fruit trees or a vegetable garden? If you have surplus, share or swap with your neighbours
- Offer to lend a hand to a neighbour who might be less able
- Start a book sharing routine (if you have the same interests)

- Bond over pets
- Spend more time in your front garden this provides more opportunity to bump into your neighbours
- Become a welcome party for any new residents
- Don't be afraid to ask for help yourself needing a cup of sugar is a great way to get to know your neighbour
- Get active! Walks around your neighbourhood are a great way to meet residents
- Turn backyard cricket into street cricket (if safe to do so in your street)
